SCHEDULE TYPES AND INSTRUCTION METHODS

Schedule Types are set up based on how the course was approved for the course catalog by the University Curriculum Committee and exist for identifying and reporting information about Academic Scheduling.

Instructional method is the delivery method for a specific section of a course. Together, the schedule type and instructional method reflect the educational technology and the use of facilities, materials, and equipment.

The following schedule types and instructional methods are available:

Schedule Type List

	Description	Section Number Designations
Lecture (LEC)	A course where the delivery of instruction is by the instructor's face-to-face presentation of academic subject matter.	001-099
Laboratory (LAB)	The supplemental portion of a course designated for experimental hands-on observation or practice in a field of study.	100-119, 121-132, 141-199
Seminar (S)	A course for students studying under the direction of an instructor for the purpose of presenting and exchanging scholarly ideas or research findings.	Any

Independent Study (IND)	A course of organized instruction or research determined solely by a student and his/her instructor.	Any
Dissertation (DIS)	Faculty-supervised student development and completion of an original research topic in the student's major area and defense of the dissertation proposal and the dissertation.	001-099
Field Experience (FLD)	A course requiring students to participate in a partnership, professional employment, work experience, or cooperative education with an entity external to the institution, usually under the supervision of an employee of the given external entity.	001-099
Clinical (CLN)	A course requiring medical- or healthcare focused experiential work where students test, observe, experiment, or practice a field or discipline in a hands-on or simulated environment.	001-099 101-199
Practicum/Co-op (PRA)	A course providing supervised training, practical applications, or exposure to a discipline or profession.	Any
Combined Lecture/Lab (LLB)	A course requiring the combined attributes of a lecture course and a lab/clinical.	001-099 101-199 R sections
Internship (INT)	A course requiring students to participate in a partnership, professional employment, work experience, or cooperative education with an entity external	001-099 500-599

Studio (STU)	to the institution, under the supervision of an employee of the given external entity. Contract and/or syllabus required.	
	Studio describes a class in which all students are engaged in creative or artistic activities which are new and unique and not formulated in a lecture setting. Every student in the room is performing a creative activity to obtain a specific outcome. It is a course requiring visual- or aesthetic-focused experiential work where students test, observe, experiment, or practice a field or discipline in a hands-on environment. Because it is not instruction-based, this requires more minute-to-minute responsibility for the faculty member to engage individual students towards their goal.	001-099 300-399

	Description	Section Number Designations
Conventional (CON)	Conventional is in-person instruction and is a course conducted in a traditional classroom. The instructor and students all meet in the	Non –5XX and –RXX sections

	same room at the same time.	
Hybrid (HYB)	A course that combines both classroom instruction and online instruction. All students attend class in person, but the amount of time spent in the classroom is reduced from the standard number of meeting hours per credit and replaced by online learning activities.	Non -5XX and -RXX sections
Online (WEB)	A course that meets exclusively online. This includes a course that meets fully online with no scheduled meeting dates or times (asynchronous) and a course that meets fully online with students required to participate in online meetings/lectures at specific days and times (synchronous).	-5XX or an -RXX for TN eCampus sections.
