
Fall 2024 Enrollment

Total headcount: 10,511

- 9,187 undergraduate
- 1,324 graduate


More than 3,000 new students

- 2,006 new first-time freshmen
- 586 new transfer students
- 417 new graduate students



New Freshmen

- 2,006 new first-time freshmen
 - 4th largest class in Tech history
- Average ACT: 24.1
- Average high school GPA: 3.67
 - Nearly 700 with 4.0
- Tech's Presidential Scholars Program: 1,047
- National Merit Semifinalists: 4






New Freshmen Class

- 88 of Tennessee's 95 counties
- 30 other states
- 19 other countries
- Ages range from 16-41
- 16 have served or serving in U.S. military

• Overall: 78.2%


Presidential Scholars: 88.1%

Graduation Rates

- 4-year: 41.2% (started 2020 and finished by 2024; all-time high)
- 6-year: 57.7% (started 2018 and finished by 2024)

How did we succeed?

Examined data collected throughout recruitment cycle

Both students who enrolled AND those who did not

Invested in targeted marketing

- Feeder schools, geographic locations, populations, student actions
- Results (per Student View survey of high school students):
 - Awareness score highest on record
 - Strongest relative position in state since 2010
 - Fourth consecutive year consideration went up



How did we succeed?

Invested in Presidential Scholars program

 Early statistical work by faculty member in College of Education shows receiving Presidential Scholarship is biggest indicator student likely to enroll at Tech

Increased engagement between faculty and prospective students

- Prospective students want to hear from faculty members and students in their future academic homes
