## Who is a Commuter Student?

Any freshman commuting from their parent/legal guardian's main residence.

8,838 total undergraduate enrollment (Fall 2023)

2,281 residential

#### 6,557 commuter

Myth: Commuter students are not able to be as involved and engaged as their residential classmates.

## **Expectations of Commuters**

Same as residential students!

- Be on time and attend classes
- Take responsibility for assignments (group & individual)
- Utilize resources and seek assistance when necessary
- Communicate with faculty & advisors

## Challenges

- Getting to campus & parking
- Weather & closings
- Time management (work & home responsibilities vs. college responsibilities)
- Navigating home/family expectations
- Feeling connected & sense of belonging

## Parent Tips: Getting to Campus


Encourage your student to build in plenty of time.

- Pro Tip: Check map/traffic and weather apps while getting ready for the day.




## Parent Tip: Time On Campus

#### **High School Schedule**




#### **College Schedule**



## Commuter Class Scheduling Strategy

## Cramming classes into two days:

- Makes for really long days
- Mental fatigue (less focused)
- More tempting to skip classes
- Greater impact when you get sick
- Multiple assignments due/exams on the same day

#### **Spacing classes out:**

- Allows more time to complete assignments/prepare for exams
- More peer interactions & engagement on campus
- Eliminates falling out of a routine

Financial expectations.


Campus engagement.


