Welcome to Talon Tracks, a new monthly newsletter from the university's Office of Business & Fiscal Affairs and Office of Human Resources!

Earlier this year, Tennessee Tech announced plans to transition to a new cloud-based system known as "Talon" that will replace the Banner system that has been in use for nearly two decades (see President Oldham's video announcement [here](#)).

This transition, set to take place over the next 12-18 months, will streamline our business and human resources processes, improve security and accessibility, and offer a better end-user experience for university employees.



Where are we now?

Implementation of Talon is well underway. The university's HR and Finance teams are participating in the first of three Conference Room Pilots (CRPs), each representing key stages of the project.

CRP 1 (March/April 2024) is focused on understanding all of the business requirements, technical architecture, and how the application will meet these needs, in addition to

identifying any gaps. This information will be used in designing and configuring the new system that will be further refined and tested in CRP 2 (June/July 2024) and CRP3 (September/October 2024) before the final test, referred to as User Acceptance Testing or UAT (June 2025), which signifies that the application has been tested, validated, and is ready for full implementation.

Why it matters

While not every university employee uses Banner, or may need to use Talon, the system helps facilitate key university processes and operations that matter to all of us - from paying our faculty, staff and vendors, to purchasing items for your offices and classrooms and reserving space for campus events.

Talon will offer a modernized, more user-friendly experience with less third-party applications for university employees to navigate. Employees who may not have utilized certain Banner functionalities may find that they choose to do so under the new system because of its improved usability.

What's next?

For many employees, there is no immediate action necessary on your part. Over the coming weeks and months, the ERP project team will reach out to various stakeholders for your feedback and involvement as testing moves forward.
